

KNOW THE FIRE DRILL



SHOOTING SAFETY STARTS WITH FIRE SENSE

EXPLODING TARGETS ARE NEVER
ALLOWED ON PUBLIC LANDS.



AVOID STEEL CORE/TIP/JACKET BULLETS.

Choose paper or clay
targets & lead core
bullets in outdoor areas.



CALL 911 TO REPORT A FIRE

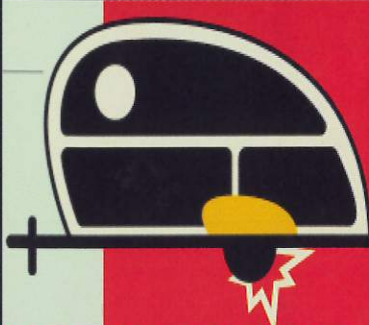
Stay on the phone with

VEHICLE SAFETY STARTS WITH FIRE SENSE

DON'T DRIVE ON DRY GRASS OR
BRUSH. HOT EXHAUST PIPES AND
MUFFLERS CAN CAUSE FIRES.



BRAKES WORN TOO
THIN MAY CAUSE
METAL TO METAL
CONTACT WHICH CAN
CAUSE A SPARK.



CHECK TIRE PRESSURE

Maintain proper tire pressure.
Driving on exposed wheel
rims will throw sparks.

vehicle & learn how
to use it.

KNOW THE SAFETY TIPS

CHOOSE AN AREA FREE OF
VEGETATION & AVOID SHOOTING
ON WINDY DAYS.



Never place targets on
boulders or rocky areas
with dry vegetation. Keep
targets on dirt or gravel.



Only detonate exploding
targets in lawful areas
that are clear of dry
vegetation.



KNOW THE SAFETY TIPS

PRACTICE SAFE TOWING.
DRAGGING CHAINS
THROW SPARKS.



Ensure tow chains are the correct
length & won't drag on the ground.

Use appropriate
safety pins & hitch
ball to secure
chains.

OHV's and dirt bikes
must be equipped
with spark arrestors.

DEBRIS BURNING SAFETY STARTS WITH FIRE SENSE

PROPERLY BURNING DEBRIS
HELPS PREVENT WILDFIRES.



Notify your local fire department and obtain the appropriate approval or burn permit for your area.

An adult must be present until the fire is out.



Keep a fire extinguisher, shovel & extra water on hand in case fire escapes!

CAMPFIRE SAFETY STARTS WITH FIRE SENSE

PRACTICE SAFE CAMPING
PROCEDURES.



DROWN THE FIRE, STIR WITH A SHOVEL.

FEEL TO ENSURE NOTHING IS HOT.

REPEAT UNTIL THE FIRE IS COLD TO THE TOUCH.



An adult must be present until the fire is out.

PUT OUT YOUR CAMPFIRE

Keep a shovel and water nearby in case fire escapes.



EQUIPMENT SAFETY STARTS WITH FIRE SENSE

USING EQUIPMENT SAFELY
HELPS PREVENT WILDFIRES.



DON'T MOW IN ROCKY AREAS.
Metal blades striking rocks can cause sparks & start fires. Mow before 10am, but never when it's windy or dry.



CALL 911 TO REPORT A FIRE

Stay on the phone with the dispatcher until help arrives.



Keep a fire extinguisher, shovel & extra water on hand in case a fire does start!



KNOW THE SAFETY TIPS

DON'T BURN IN HOT, DRY AND WINDY WEATHER CONDITIONS.



10 FT

Clear all flammable material within a 10 ft distance.



Dry vegetation found on site may be burned unless prohibited by local ordinances.



4 FT

Keep debris in small piles of no more than 4 ft wide.



KNOW THE SAFETY TIPS

CHECK FIRE RESTRICTIONS BEFORE LIGHTING A FIRE.



Use an existing firepit if one is present.

If there isn't an available firepit, clear a flat, open area down to the soil, at least 5 ft from the fires edge.



Keep the fire no larger than necessary.

Make a depression in the center of the clearing to build your fire in. Place a ring of rocks.



KNOW THE SAFETY TIPS

KEEP ALL EQUIPMENT IN PROPER WORKING ORDER & FREE OF CARBON BUILDUP



Use the recommended grade of fuel & don't top it off.

In wildland areas, spark arrestors are required on all portable, gasoline powered equipment.



In wildland areas, grinding and welding require a permit during fire restrictions & 10 ft of clearance.

Don't drive your vehicle onto dry grass or brush.
